All hunters buy a hunting and fishing license plus Govt. Tags/Seals for all species (Sheep, Grizzly, Moose, Caribou, Black Bear, Wolf and Wolverine)

Deposits, Payments, & Cancellations

A current year hunt is booked with a 50% deposit. To hold a future hunt date, more than 1 year out, requires a 25% deposit. Final payment is due June 1st the year of your hunt. Deposits and hunt payments are non-refundable but can be transferred for the same year and dates to another party who is not a current YSO client.

Trophy Fees

Trophy fees for additional trophies must be presented prior to beginning the hunt. There is 5% Tax on all YSO trophy fees and Govt. Royalties. No personal checks accepted. Trophy fees become due upon wounding or harvesting an animal. Upon wounding an animal, you and your guide will spend any remaining hunting time trying to locate that particular animal. If not found, we will continue to look as we are able after your departure in hopes of recovering your trophy.

Arrival & Departure

All hunts start and end in Whitehorse, Yukon, which is accessible by several airline services (Air Canada, Air North, West Jet). You will arrive, the day before your chartered flight into our hunting area. If time allows, we recommend you arrive an extra day early (2 nights in Whitehorse), as we can't delay our chartered flights for missing luggage. On the first day of the trip, you will fly approx. 110 air miles to our base camp or directly into your hunting camp to meet your guide. On the last day of the hunt, you will fly back to Whitehorse. You will be assisted with checking trophies when you arrive back in Whitehorse, if Govt. offices are open, or you may leave them with us, and we'll ship them at the end of the season. You should schedule your departing flight to leave the next day (one night in Whitehorse). If you want to take meat or trophies home with you, it is important to inform us well in advance of your hunt so that we can prepare the appropriate logistics and paperwork required to export the meat, and we recommend staying in Whitehorse for an additional day (2 nights total), before departing. There is always the chance of a weather delay, so make sure your return ticket is easy to change. We recommend using a professional travel agent and do not recommend using air miles or discount online ticket sites, for booking hunting trips. If you need to arrive or depart on unscheduled flight days, there will be additional charges.

Trophy Care

Trophy care on your hunt includes caping, fleshing and salting of all hides, horns and antlers in the field. To make shipping and transporting easier, we recommend that all non-record book sized moose and caribou skulls be split, unless you prefer a European mount. Grizzly and Wolf skulls/hides require a CITES permit, which will be obtained once your hunt is over, and must be shipped to your taxidermist. Moose and caribou antlers have to be shipped as they are too large for the airlines. We will aid in the expediting services including shipping of your trophies and we do this through the services of a local taxidermist who will then ship your mounted trophies to the address of your choosing. All shipping and crating is at the hunter's expense.

Meat Handling

If you wish to take meat home with you and there is room in the departing charter plane, we limit the quantity to no more than 40 lbs, which is an amount that doesn't require a Gov't issued export permit. If you do take meat to Whitehorse, you'll need to purchase a cooler at the local hardware store and freeze the meat at the hotel prior to your departure.

The rest of the meat recovered from the field will be processed and distributed locally to various groups of people in need in the Territory including First Nations communities, the hospital, and women's shelter. Distribution of meat locally is important to the Yukon Stone mission and very important to maintaining our hunting and outfitting privileges, and as such, we do not offer the opportunity to transport an entire moose or caribou back home with you.

Gear List/Itinerary/Additional Information

Information will be emailed to you, after your hunt is booked. It will contain an equipment list, suggested fitness plan, travel tips, assistance with airline flights & hotel reservations, emergency phone numbers Canadian Firearms Declaration Form and other information regarding all aspects of your trip. We provide camp equipment, meals, lodging & guides, plus horse, boat or airplane travel within the area. Call anytime with questions this document did not answer.
